

To develop creativity and capacity for analytical thinking, our students of primary section are exposed to various co-curricular activities ranging from debates to Jam, theater to arts, dance, music and band, craft and painting throughout the course of an academic session. These plethora of activities help to nurture the inherent talents of our students.

GRADE 1 - SAFETY MATTERS

Grade 1 students enthusiastically participated in different activities to instill the essential value of various life skills. They narrated stories on topics like safety and sharing is caring. Assembly on safety gave them opportunity to learn that **"precaution is better than cure"**. Awareness about private body parts was given to children, they acquired a better knowledge about good touch and bad touch.

To understand the concept of time, clock making was done with paper plate. In English **Show and Tell** activity was done for teaching adjectives wherein the students described their one favorite object. This enhanced speaking skills of students besides developing their vocabulary.

Grade 2 children did a very interesting activity of germination, which is a practical way of demonstrating the growth of plant from seed witnessing each stage. Children were taught theoretical aspect of germination and did this activity at home. They had to take a seed, a jar or an open container, add some soil and sow any seed of their choice. They had to water the seed daily and put it in sunlight. Children were also educated about how the plant makes food with help of water and sunlight. Parts of the plant were also shown and demonstrated. Children were very excited to do the activity. Some of them also made a table date wise to precisely note the date of germination process. They were imparted with the knowledge of planting trees to save the Earth.

WE ARE EVER READY MR. EXAMINER

Assessing children is difficult because young children learn in ways and at rates different from older children and adults, we must tailor our assessments accordingly. Because young children come to know things through doing as well as through listening, and because they often represent their knowledge better by showing than by talking or writing, paper-and-pencil tests are not adequate. Because young children do not have the experience to understand what the goals of formal testing are, testing interactions may be very difficult or impossible to structure appropriately. Because young children develop and learn so fast, tests given at one point in time may not give a complete picture of learning. And because young children's achievements at any point are the result of a complex mix of their ability to learn and past learning opportunities, it is a mistake to interpret measures of past learning as evidence of what could be learned. Yet parents want to know if their children will be ready for school. Teachers and school administrators want to know if their programs are effective and if they are providing children the right programs and services.

This is the reason why at Monarch a series of specially tailored assessment strategies are involved in assessing a child throughout their learning period. This include concept recaps which give specific achievement and unit test which helps to know more about post learning and **IDPs** which helps to analyse applicability knowledge gained. Concept Recaps and Unit Tests were successfully completed for **Grade 1-9** by the last week of November leaving teachers and students in a happy relaxed activity week before the school closes for the Winter break.


