MONARCH TEACHERS VOLUNTEER FOR CAMHS VIRTUAL SUMMER CAMP






SUMMER CAMP FOR PRIMARY WING STUDENTS

Healthy Minds, Healthy lives



It's a new beginning, a fresh starting after summer break. So while opening their minds, and pushing out the fear, students enjoyed their first day of school in the school premises.
















The classes for IInd Term at DPS monarch school after the summer break commenced on 24th August.

FASTEST KID TO IDENTIFY 100 CAR LOGOS

KRISHAN DAYALAN

Krishan Dayalan is a kindergarten student studying in DPS – Monarch International School has become a holder in Indian Book of Records for being the fastest kid to identify 100 car logos within a minute. But the journey was never easy. A lot of hardwork and concentration has made him achieve his goals. He has been a smart boy in his academics, but achieving this at a young age is a milestone.

The mind that opens to a new idea never returns to its original size is exactly that Krishen's mind was all about.

According to his parents, Krishan was interested in cars from a very small age. Once, at a car service shop, he started identifying the cars by their logos. He was able to identify most of them except for 1 or 2. He was very curious in knowing them. He used to ask us and learn. Later we heard of the Indian Book of Records (IBR) through a friend. We identified a record in alignment with his interest. We prepared a presentation with the logos and taught Krishan. He grasped their names quickly and was able to tell them with speed. Initially he was able to identify 75 logos in a minute.

But the team at IBR had informed us that there was already another record by a kid who had identified 100 logos in 1 minute 20 seconds.

They had asked us to try to beat this record to become a record holder. Hence we trained him with a 100 national and international car logos. To our surprise he was able to identify them within a minute. So, we recorded the evidence and sent to the team of IBR. They evaluated the same and confirmed that he has achieved a record by identifying the logos in 59 seconds. Thus, Krishan became the Indian Book of Records holder for being the fastest kid to identify 100 car logos.





CODING BOOT CAMP FOR GRADE 4-5

It was conducted by **StayQrious.** They discussed about computer program and methods to write codes for a program. He demonstrated it using the turtle art software.
