
Principal, Ms. Meenal Bakshi had also launched a tree plantation drive by planting sapling at our school campus along with 500 students.

Overall, the Science Gala was very informative and enriching for our students.





This unique experience motivated some of the students to dream a career in Indian Navy.




TEACHERS' DAY CELEBRATION

A series of workshops were organized for the teachers spanning a period of two weeks from August 21st to August 31st by Mr. Shrivastava and Ms. Saloni Srivastava. Mr Sandeep Srivastava an educationist. Srivastava with an M.Tech. in computer science from IIT-Delhi and an MBA from INSEAD France. The teachers took this immense opportunity to brush up their skills. They got the chance to discuss, understand and internalize the practical problems related to education. It was an

He reiterated that the teaching shouldn't be limited to the passive learning as it doesn't lead to a purposeful outcome of an educational model. Rather the children should be involved in active learning wherein they interact with others, share insights, or contribute to a dialogue and enhance their communicative skills.

The series of workshops concluded stating that concepts are not a knowledge set to be memorized; rather it is a skill to be acquired by practicing and analysing.



TEACHERS' PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

PAEDIATRIC FIRST AID WORKSHOP



The school organised a workshop on Paediatric First Aid on 14 December 2019 at the school Multi-Purpose Hall. The first training was conducted by Dr Joseph Johnson (paediatrician) from Asian Medical Centre. The workshop was attended by all teaching and non-teaching staff of the school. First Aid generally consists a simple or a series of potentially lifesaving techniques that

an individual can be trained to perform with minimal equipment or the absence of professional help. The training focused on this basic but potentially lifesaving techniques such as Aim of First Aid, how to perform CPR, Definition and types of bandages, wound care, how to manage everyday minor accidents, learn how to give first aid to an unconscious and breathing casualty, manage minor cuts,

bruises, dislocations, electric shock, snake bites, burns and the safety guidelines to be followed by the person administering the first aid. The contact numbers to be contacted in case of emergencies were also discussed. By the end of the session all were more confident and mentally equipped to deal with any unlikely event of an accident.



WORKSHOP ON EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

On 30th November 2019, Ms. Durga Sree Mavuru conducted a comprehensive workshop for our teachers on Effective Communication. The session started with a fantastic activity where teachers were divided into groups and asked to compete against each other. The idea behind was to raise interest towards an activity. Later on each group was given a topic to prepare and present. This was to focus on conveying a concept effectively.

The main motive of this interaction was to enlighten the teachers with the use of correct English and its importance. 



Why I like this book?



Favourite incident in the book





وهكذا فإن البيت والمدرسة هما الأساس لتكوين الأجيال الصالحة فالكل راع ومسئول عن رعيته.





Ecosystem Pioneer: Seagrasses Need Protection

The Seagrass bed is a luxuriously productive ecosystem, even more productive than coral reef and mangrovia forest ecosystems. In Qatar, this ecosystem is home to a total of four species of seagrass: Narrow Leaf Seagrass, Oval Leaf Seagrass, Broad Leaf Seagrass and the Turtle Seagrass, all highly adapted to the high salinity of the Arabian Gulf waters. Interestingly, although these are called seagrasses, they are instead flowering plants, closely related to pondweeds. Seagrasses are ecosystem pioneers, because they are the first settlers in a sandy sea floor along with microbes. The growth pattern of their stems, rhizomes extending horizontally, helps stabilize sand and sediment in place creating habitats for other organisms. This characteristic makes them ecosystem engineers. The organisms that are permanent residents, have evolved adaptations either to burrowing or to living in narrow places between, or on seagrass leaves (epiphytes).

Seagrass beds are nursery grounds to juveniles of many species, including shrimp, crab, fish, and Pearl Oyster.

Other organisms that inhabit or have feeding grounds on this ecosystem include molluscs, crustaceans, Black Sea Cucumbers, Green Tiger prawn, sea turtles and snakes. These are either herbivores consuming seagrass, or carnivores that consume the herbivores. The magnificent Dugong, or sea cow, is a frequent visitor, since seagrasses are the major nutritional source of its diet. Climate change phenomena pose a threat to the health of seagrass beds as an ecosystem and to its inhabitants. Coastline development is another threat causing habitat loss.

FATHER FORGETS

W. Livingston Larned

Listen, son: I am saying this as you lie asleep, one little paw crumpled under your cheek and the blond curls stickily wet on your damp forehead. I have stolen into your room alone. Just a few minutes ago, as I sat reading my paper in the library, a stifling wave of remorse swept over me. Guiltily I came to your bedside.

There are things I was thinking, son: I had been cross to you. I scolded you as you were dressing for school because you gave your face merely a dab with a towel. I took you to task for not cleaning your shoes. I called out angrily when you threw some of your things on the floor.

At breakfast I found fault, too. You spilled things. You gulped down your food. You put your elbows on the table. You spread the butter too thick on your bread. And as you started off to play and I made for my train, you turned and waved a hand and called "Goodbye, Daddy!" and I frowned and said in reply, "Hold your shoulders back!".

Then it began all over again in late afternoon. As I came up the road I

spied on you, down on your knees, playing marbles. There were holes in your socks. I humiliated you before your friends by marching you ahead of me to the house.

Do you remember, later, when I was reading in the library, how you came in timidly, with a sort of hurt feeling in your eyes? When I glanced up over my paper, impatient at the interruption, you hesitated at the door. "What is it you want?" I snapped. You said nothing, but ran across in one swift plunge, and threw your arms around my neck and kissed me goodnight, and your small arms tightened with the affection that God has set blooming in your heart and which even neglect could not wither. And then you were gone pattering up the stairs.

Well, son, it was shortly afterwards that my paper slipped from my hands and a terrible sickening fear came over me. What has habit doing to me? The habit of finding fault, of reprimanding- this was my reward to you for being a boy. It was not that I did not love you; it was that I expected too much from you. I was measuring you by the yardstick of my own years. And there was so much that was good and fine and true in your character. The little heart of you was as big as the dawn itself over the wide hills. This was shown by your spontaneous impulse to rush in and kiss me goodnight. Nothing else matters tonight, son.

I have come to your bedside in the darkness, and I have knelt there ashamed!

It is feeble atonement; I know you would not understand these things if I told them to you during your waking hours. But tomorrow I will be a real daddy! I will chum with you and suffer when you suffer and laugh when you laugh. I will bite my tongue when impatient words come. I will keep saying if it were a ritual: "He is nothing but a boy- a little boy!" I am afraid I have visualized you as a man. Yet as I see now, son, crumpled and weary in your cot, I see that you are still a baby. Yesterday you were in your mother's arms, your head on her shoulder. I have asked too much, too much.

Often parents and teachers are tempted to criticize their children. Instead of criticizing let us try to understand them. Let's try to figure out why they do and what they do. That is a lot more profitable and intriguing than criticism, and it breeds sympathy, tolerance and kindness. "To know all is to forgive all."

ഒരുവന് മറ്റൊരാളുമായി ഹൃദയം കൊണ്ട് സംവദിക്കാൻ കഴിയുന്നത് അവന്റെ മാതൃഭാഷയിലൂടെയാണ്. അപരിചിതമായ ഒന്നിനെ ഗ്രഹിക്കാൻ നമ്മെ ഏറെ സഹായിക്കുന്നത് മാതൃഭാഷയാണ്. മലയാള നാടിന്റെ സംസ്കാരം നാം തൊട്ടറിയുന്നത് മലയാളഭാഷയിലൂടെയാണ്.

ഭാഷ ഭാഷണമാണ് എന്നും പറയാറുണ്ട്. ഭാഷയുടെ ആദി രൂപവും ജീവൽ സ്വരൂപവും ഭാഷണം ആണെന്നുള്ളതും തർക്കമില്ല.

എല്ലാ ഭാഷകളുടേയും ചരിത്രം സങ്കീർണ്ണമാണ് മലയാളത്തിന്റേയും.

മുവായിരംകൊല്ലം മുമ്പ് തെക്കേ ഇന്ത്യയിലെ ആൾക്കാർ സംസാരിച്ചിരുന്ന പൊതുഭാഷ :ആദിദ്രാവിഡഭാഷ പഴംതമിഴ് ഭാഷ യിൽനിന്ന് ഉരുത്തിരിഞ്ഞുവന്ന ഭാഷയാണ് മലയാളം. മറ്റൊല്ലാ ഭാഷകളിലും ഉള്ളതുപോലെ തമിഴിലും ദേശഭേദങ്ങൾ ഉണ്ടായിരുന്നു. ഇതിൽ ഒരു വകഭേദമായ കൊടുംതമിഴാണ് പിന്നേട് മലനാട്ടിലെ ഭാഷയായ മലയാളമായി പരിണമിച്ചതെന്ന് ഭാഷാ ശാസ്ത്രജ്ഞന്മാർ കരുതുന്നു.

ദ്രാവിദ്രാവിഡഭാഷാകുടുംബത്തിലെ ഒരു ശാഖയാണ് മലയാളം. 'മല' എന്ന പദത്തോട് 'അളം' 'ആഴം' 'ആളം'

എന്നിങ്ങനെ യുള്ള പദങ്ങളിലാണ് ചേർന്ന് ഉണ്ടായതാണ് 'മലയാളം' എന്ന പദം എന്നും പറയപ്പെടുന്നു. സഹ്യവും അറബിക്കടലിനും ഇടയിലുള്ള ദേശമാണല്ലോ നമ്മുടെ. ഈ പ്രദേശത്ത് ഒരു കാലത്ത് തമിഴിന്റെ പലതരം പ്രാദേശിക ഭേദങ്ങളാണ് ഭാഷയായി പ്രചരിച്ചിരുന്നത്. ക്രിസ്തബ്ദം ഒമ്പതാം നൂറ്റാണ്ടുമുതൽ ഉപയോഗിച്ച് കാണുന്ന ഭാഷ തമിഴിൽനിന്ന് പല വ്യത്യാസങ്ങൾ ഉള്ളഭാഷയാണ്. പതിമൂന്ന്, പതിനാല് നൂറ്റാണ്ട് എത്തിയപ്പോൾ അക്കാലത്തുണ്ടായിട്ടുള്ള സാഹിത്യകൃതികളിൽ സംസ്കൃതപദങ്ങൾ കൂടിക്കലർന്ന മിശ്രഭാഷയാണ് ഉപയോഗിച്ചുകാണുന്നത്. ഇതിൽനിന്ന് നമുക്കൊരു നിഗമനം നടത്താം. ലിഖിതഭാഷയായി സംസ്കൃതവും സംസാരഭാഷയായി ഒരു പ്രാകൃതവും ഉപയോഗിച്ചിരുന്ന ഏതെങ്കിലും ആര്യവർഗം കേരളത്തിൽ പ്രചരിച്ചിരുന്ന തമിഴ് സംസ്കൃത പദങ്ങൾ കലർത്തിയുപയോഗിച്ചിട്ടുണ്ടാകാം. ആയുർവേദം, ജ്യോതിഷം മുതലായ ശാസ്ത്രങ്ങൾ പഠിക്കാൻ ഈ മിശ്ര ഭാഷ ഉപയോഗിച്ച് പോന്നു. സംസ്കൃതത്തിലെ അതിവരങ്ങൾ (ഖ, ച, റ, ,മ, ഫ), മൃദുക്കൾ (ഗ, ജ, ഡ, ങ, ബ), ഘോഷങ്ങൾ (ഘ, ഞ, ഞ, ഞ, ഞ) (ദ്രാവിഡ ഭാഷയിലില്ല. ഈ പുതിയ വർണ്ണങ്ങളും ഉഷ്ണങ്ങളും (ശ, ഷ, സ, ഹ) (ദ്രാവിഡ ഭാഷയിലില്ല. ഈ പുതിയ വർണ്ണങ്ങൾ കൂടിച്ചേർന്ന് മലയാളത്തിലെ വർണ്ണമാല വിപുലനം ചെയ്തു. സംസ്കൃതം കലർത്തിയ മിശ്രഭാഷയുടെ സാഹിത്യത്തിന്റെ പേരാണ് മണി പ്രവാളം ഇത്തരത്തിൽ സാവധാനം നാടൻതമിഴിൽനിന്ന് വ്യത്യസ്തമായ ഭാഷാരീതി പ്രചരിച്ചത്. ഇങ്ങനെ പദാവലിയിലും വ്യാകരണത്തിലും പ്രകടമായ വ്യത്യാസങ്ങൾ ഉണ്ടായി.

ക്രിസ്തബ്ദം അഞ്ച്, പത്ത് നൂറ്റാണ്ടുകൾക്കിടയിൽ ഈ പ്രദേശത്ത് പ്രചരിച്ചിരുന്ന പ്രാദേശികമായ തമിഴിൽ നിന്നാണ് മലയാളം ഉണ്ടായത്. അന്യ ഭാഷയുടെ സമ്പർക്കത്തലാണ് പ്രാദേശികഭാഷയായ തമിഴിന് മാറ്റമുണ്ടായത്.

സഹ്യന് പടിഞ്ഞാറുള്ള കേരളത്തിലെ ജനങ്ങൾ ചരിത്രപരവും ഭൂമിശാസ്ത്രപരവുമായ കാരണത്താൽ വേർതിരിഞ്ഞു ജീവിച്ചു അതും ഇങ്ങനൊരു ഭാഷ ഉരിത്തിരിയാൻ കാരണമായി എന്ന് കരുതപ്പെടുന്നു.
