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CHILDREN'S DAY WITH UNLIMITED FUN!
















"Children are the future so nurture them right. In the end, they are the one who's going to bring change to the world and make it a better place."

"Oh, how many caravans have passed by,


Leaving behind vestiges of the fluctuations of the times,

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with love and respect towards the country.




































TREE PLANTATION DRIVE



ROLE PLAY – THE MUSICIAN OF BREMEN


"The essence of Role Playing is that it is a group, co-operative experience."








"CAN WE HAVE SOME BUTTER FOR THE ROYAL SLICE OF BREAD?" ...

Students of **Grade 5** performed three different methods of removal of insoluble impurities from water i.e filtration, sedimentation and decantation and explained the process for their classmates.














DEKHO APNA DESH - EMBASSY QUIZ
