INVESTITURE CEREMONY

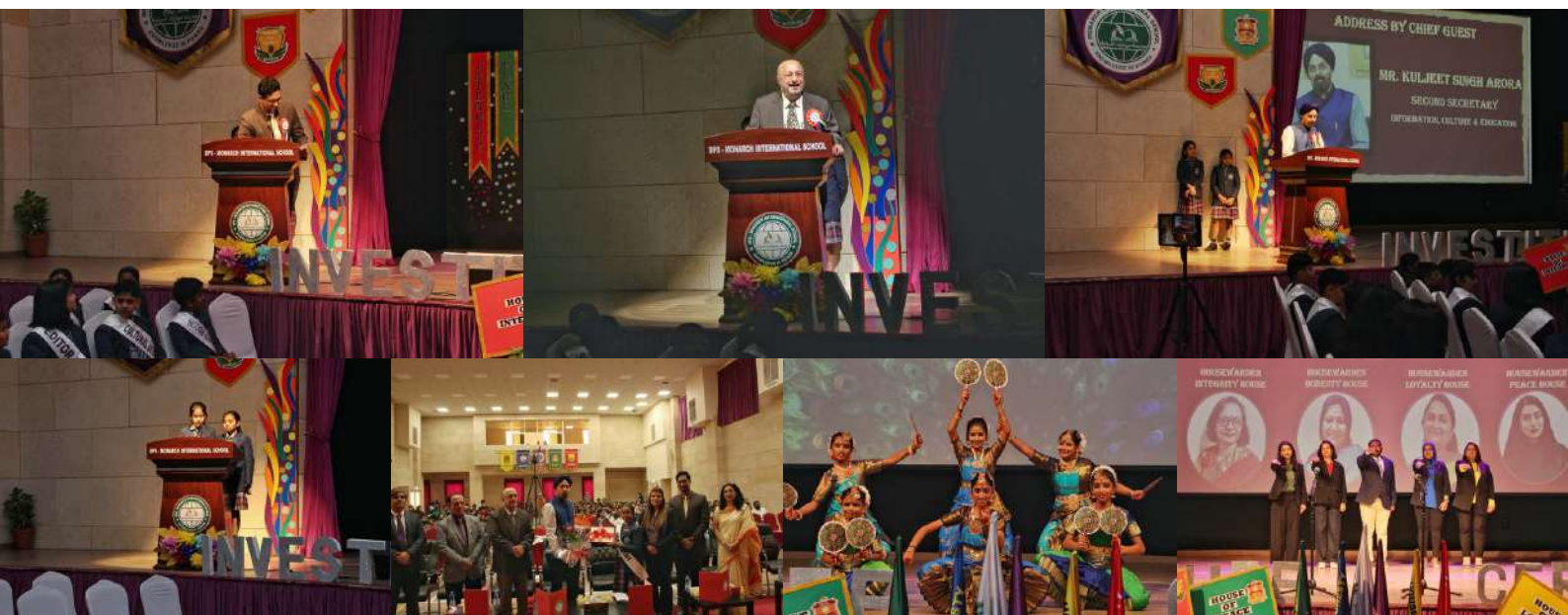

WORLD OCEANS DAY

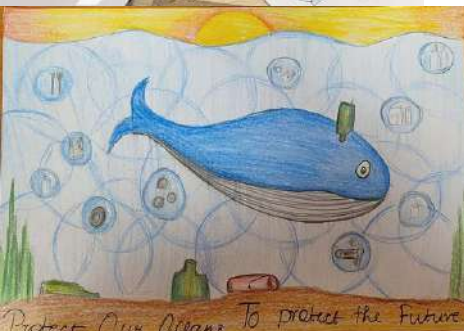
"Be a wise man, Ocean is not a garbage can!!!"

INTERDISCIPLINARY PROJECT (IDP)

Using Project Based Learning to Encourage Interdisciplinary Project (IDP), Subject Enrichment and Portfolio Work

“Education is not to reform the students or to make them expert technicians. It is to unsettle their minds, widen the horizons, inflame their intellects, and teach them to think differently.”

With this aim in mind, the school has planned an Interdisciplinary Project for the students of Grade VI to VIII and Subject Enrichment and Portfolio for Grade IX and X students in Term 1 across the core subjects. The projects are initiated to enhance collaboration and teamwork within groups of students of each class.

Project-based learning includes different Projects’ themes and topics that allow students to apply what they learn to new situations, leading to deeper learning involving two or more academic, scientific, or artistic disciplines.

This type of study allows the student to learn by making connections between ideas and concepts across different subjects. Students learning in this way are able to apply the knowledge gained in one subject to another different subject as a way to deepen the learning experience. The most effective approach to these projects enables students to build their own interdisciplinary pathway by choosing courses which make sense to them.

All the Projects are a part of Internal Assessment. It helps students to understand, introspect, explore, compare, represent and improve their knowledge in the subjects. The duration of the projects is two months and the submission date is 25th August, 2022.

CBSE REGISTRATION

CBSE EXAM 2022-23: BOARD ASKS SCHOOLS TO SUBMIT LIST OF CANDIDATES

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has initiated the registration process for all the affiliated schools to finalize the List of Candidates (LOC) who will be appearing for CBSE Board examination for the session 2022-23. The data collection for eligible candidates through LOC, according to a CBSE notification, began on June 16, 2022. Schools will be required to submit LOC through the e-pariksha link provided on the CBSE official website - cbse.gov.in.

“Only those students shall be allowed to appear for Class X and Class XII board’s examination in session 2022-23, whose names would be submitted through the online process of submission of LOC,” the CBSE notification added.

“CBSE Online Affiliated School Information System (OASIS) data should be submitted by schools before the deadline. Any correction or modification done by schools will be observed by the Regional Officers of CBSE,” the board said.

Following CBSE guidelines, DPS Monarch International School is in the process to register the students of session 22-23 for the board exam. Grade IX to XI teachers are meticulously checking and verifying students details so that it can be submitted to board errorless and before the due date.

ART AND ICT INTEGRATION

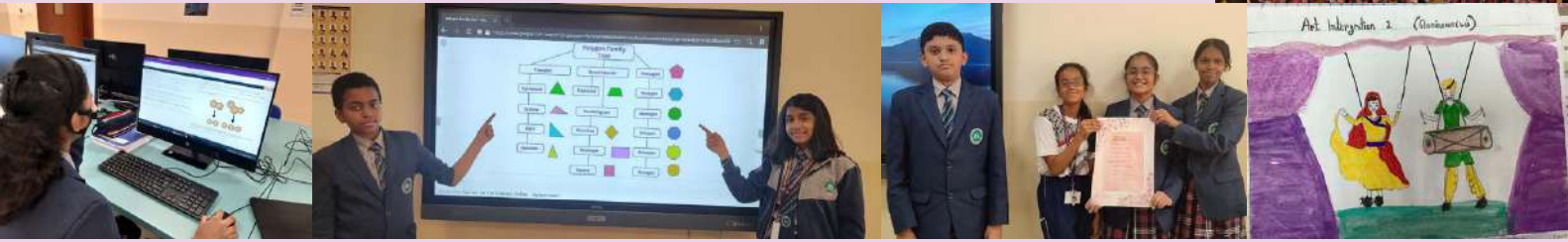

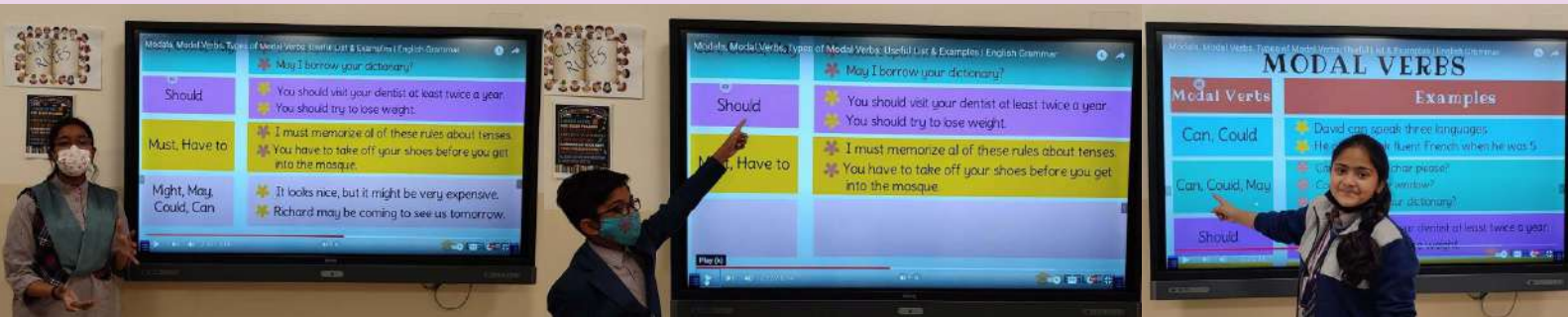
