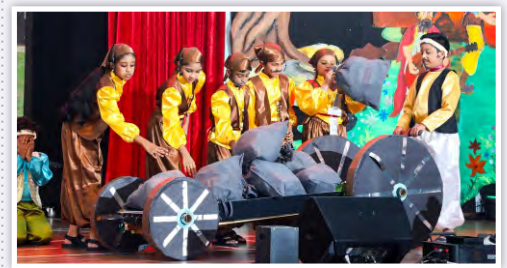
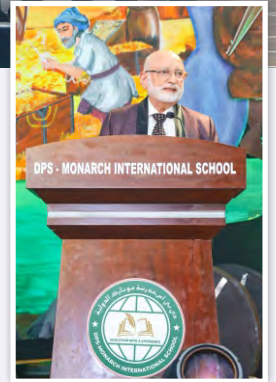

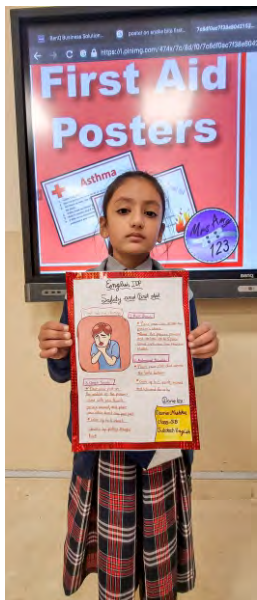
The sole objective of this project was to make the students understand the importance of safety and first aid to lead a safe life.

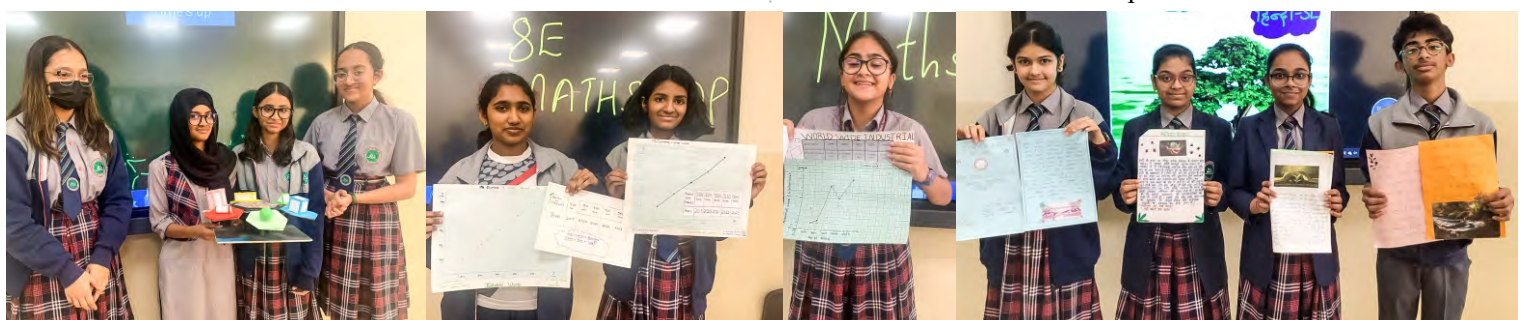
GRADE 8
