DPS Monarch International School is ecstatic to announce the remarkable 100 percent results of their first CBSE batch of Grade XII (2023-24). The inaugural batch has achieved outstanding performance in the Central Board of Secondary Education 2023-2024 Board Examinations, demonstrating diligence and determination that redefined excellence.

A total of 67 students appeared for the exam, achieving a school average of 77% and a 100% pass rate. The gross percentage secured across the various stream as follows Science 75%, Commerce 80% and Humanities 80% Notably, Rachel Kurian scored a perfect 100 in Business Studies, showcasing her passion and expertise in the subject. Overall, 79 students secured A1 grades, marking a significant milestone for the school.

The overall topper for the year is Rachel Lizbeth Kurian with 95.6% in the Commerce stream. The second toppers, both scoring 94.6%, are Saachi Dhadwal (Science stream) and Soundarya Lakshminarayan (Humanities). Athulya Subhash secured the third position with 93.8% in the Science stream, followed by Vihaan

Bringing laurels to their school and raising performance standards, Adeem Faizi of Grade 10 secured an impressive 97.8%, and Aniesh Saravan emerged as the school topper with 97.4%. Close behind is Mohammad Fauzan, with an outstanding 96.8%, followed by Arya Rathod with 96.4%, and Abdullah Arshad securing 96.2%.

Rehan Arakkal Alfas achieved the sixth position with 96%, while

GRADE X RESULT



Anto Juvan Kagoo grabbed seventh with 95.8%. Mithulashree Vijayakumar and Amey Nilesh Kulkarni tied for eighth with 95.6% each. In the ninth position are Sadia Yassmin, Nusaybah Rehan Kalsekar, Aavni Sudheesh, and Hardik Sukhnandan, all with 95.4%, and Purva Patel in tenth with 95.2%.

Out of the 147 students who appeared for the exam, the school achieved an impressive average of 84.3%. Notably, the school topper, Adeem Faizi, scored a perfect 100 in Mathematics. Additionally, 38% of students scored an aggregate of 90% and above, maintaining the school's record of a perfect 100%.

In various subjects, our students demonstrated remarkable performance: 42 students scored above 90 in English, 56 in Mathematics, 24 in Science, 41 in Social Science, 56 in Information Technology, 3 in Painting, and 64 in Second Languages. In Tamil and Malayalam, 6 students each, Arabic 4 students, French 10 students, and Hindi 38 students scored above 90.

Subject averages are as follows: English 85.3%, Social Science 82.9%, Mathematics 75.5%, Science 76.4%, Information Technology 87.8%, and Second Languages 85.96% (Hindi 84.5%, French 92.6%, Arabic 81.7%, Malayalam 87.3%, Tamil 83.7%, and Painting 92.6%).

The percentage of students scoring A1 in each subject includes 44% in English, 15% in Social Science, 24% in Mathematics, 18% in Science, 25% in Information Technology, 25% in Hindi, 14% in French, 13% in Tamil, and 20% in Painting.




Outstanding Achievements of Monarchians:




