A highlight of the evening was the Principal's Address, delivered with

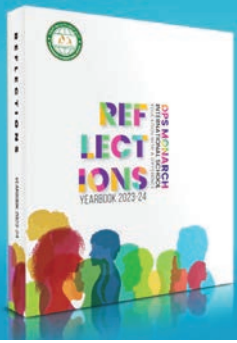

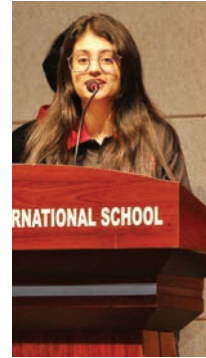
DPS Monarch International School proudly hosted its first-ever **TEDx** event on 9th November 2024 showcasing a gathering of influential speakers and the school community.

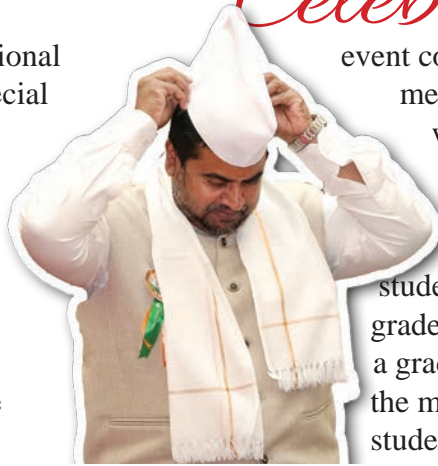

Happy children day to every child on this wonderful Planet Earth.

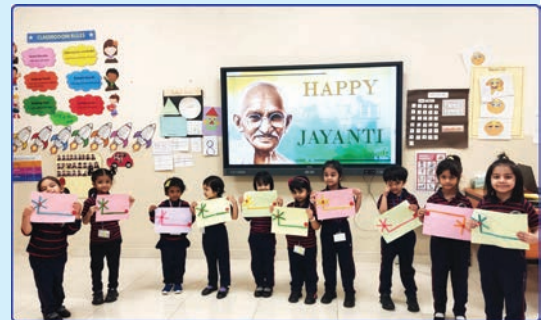
Little Hearts Celebrate Gandhi Jayanti: Lessons of Peace and Nonviolence

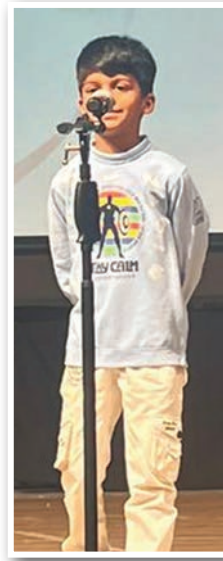
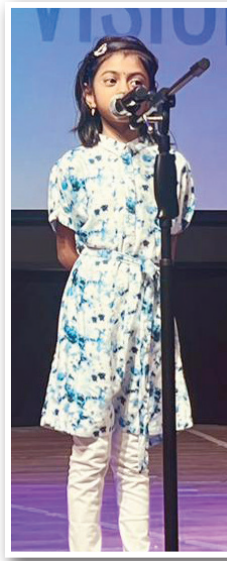
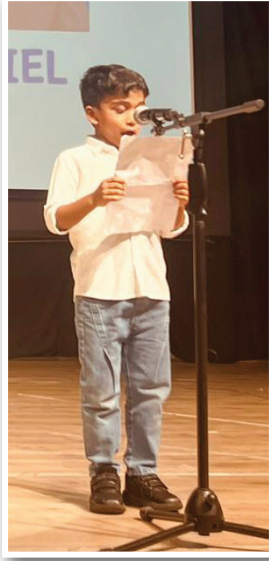
towards the elderly, differently abled and even towards animals. A song on kindness and compassion made the program more lively and vibrant.

Each creation was a reflection of their

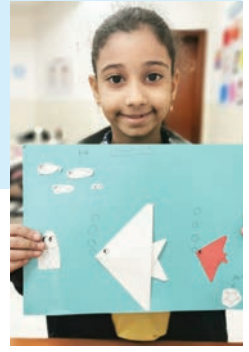


imagination, bringing joy and inspiration throughout the month. It was a wonderful journey filled with colorful expressions and creative fun!

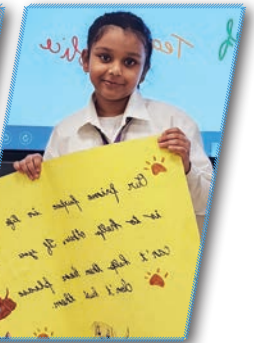
as origami, our little artists of grade 2 were busy with this craft wherein they enjoyed and learnt making animal origami, like fox face, finger puppets and fish.

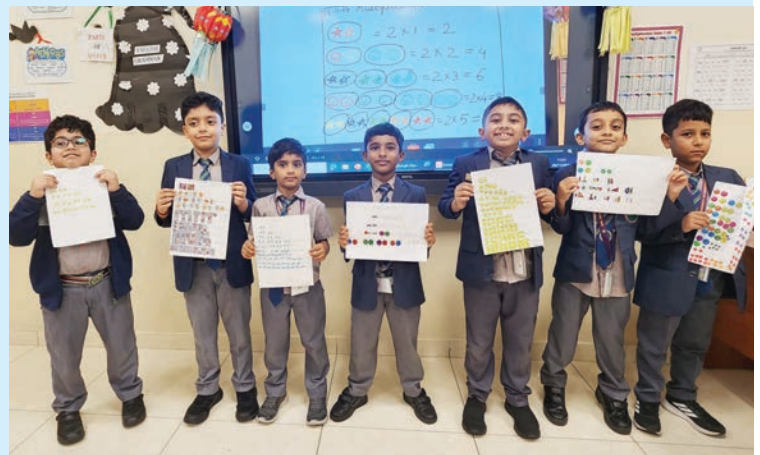

SAFAL stands for Structured Assessment for Analyzing Learning, an initiative by the CBSE aimed at competency-based assessment. It is designed to evaluate students' understanding of core concepts, higher-order thinking skills, and their ability to apply learning to real-life situations.

At DPS Monarch, students in Grades 5 and 8 (now in Grades 6 and 9 for the 2024–2025 session) were assessed in Language, Science, and Mathematics through multiple-choice questions. This diagnostic assessment has been instrumental in tracking their learning progress throughout the year.



UNLEASHING CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION IN EVERY PROJECT: MAKING LEARNING FUN, HANDS-ON, AND EXCITING

As part of our STEAM Week (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math), students from Grades 6, 7, and 8 engaged in dynamic, hands-on activities designed to deepen their understanding of scientific principles while fostering creativity, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills. Each grade undertook different projects aligned with their learning levels, emphasizing practical application, collaboration, and exploration.

Grade 6: Car Engineering Project

Grade 6 students embraced an exciting engineering challenge by designing and building balloon-powered cars.

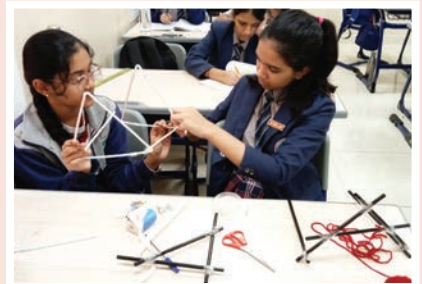
Utilizing materials like plastic bottles,

bottle caps, straws, skewers, and balloons, they explored concepts of force, motion, and basic mechanics. Through this project, students learned how to construct functional cars, test their performance, and refine their designs for greater efficiency. This experience introduced them to fundamental engineering concepts while emphasizing creativity, trial and error, and teamwork.

Grade 7: Beam Bridge Construction

In Grade 7, students tackled the challenge of designing and constructing model beam bridges using plastic drinking

straws and tape. Working collaboratively in engineering teams, they created truss patterns and tested various geometric shapes to understand their impact on structural strength. This hands-on activity not only fostered teamwork and problem-solving skills but also taught essential engineering principles.



Grade 8: The "Apple Annihilator" Experiment

Grade 8 students conducted the "Apple Annihilator" experiment during STEAM Week. In teams, they built apple-based wrecking balls to knock down marker "bowling pins." This project allowed students to explore Newton's Third Law of Motion, potential and kinetic energy, and basic engineering concepts in an engaging manner.



Each project offered a unique learning experience tailored to the students' developmental stages, enriching their knowledge and preparing them for future STEAM explorations.

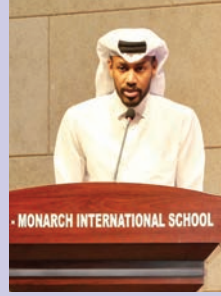

cyber and physical-while also raising awareness about their Juvenile Rights. Students were encouraged to ask questions and clarify any concerns they had regarding their rights and safety.

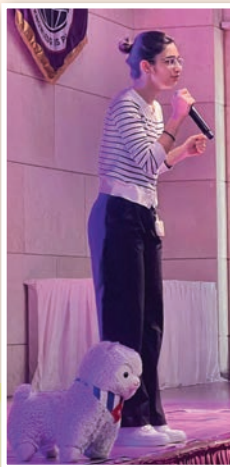
The session was highly appreciated by the students and provided them with crucial knowledge about their rights as juveniles, empowering them to protect themselves and others.

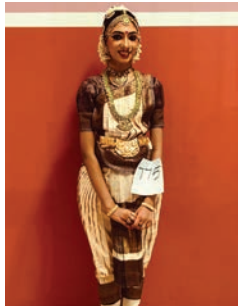

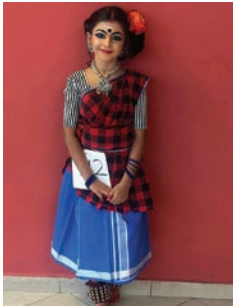

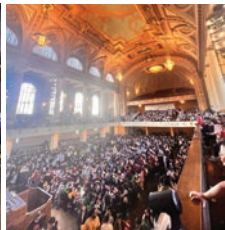
Day 2 (15 Nov): Seniors stepped into the spotlight, following the same exciting schedule, and setting the tone for the challenges ahead.

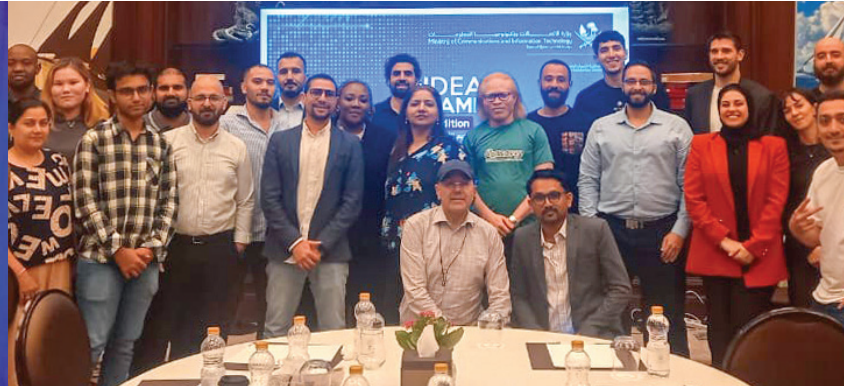
